measures that overhauled the City's antiquated budget process and guarantee health care to all residents, spearheaded efforts to create a more efficient HIV/ADS care delivery system and has been a leader to protect PWAs from discrimination in both the private and public sector.

Since winning re-lection in November 1994, she has worked to create nationally-recognized standards for public notification and testing of water supplies for Cryptosporidium, a parasite that can be deadly to people with weakened immune systems. She created a task force to create testing and notification standards for people with AIDS, which is expected to become a model for water utilities nationwide.

"Supervisor Migden again has taken the lead on a vital health care issue for our community," said Tony Leone, vice president of the Harvey Milk Club and a person being treated for Crypto, "She intuitively made this a top priority before most people even realized that PWAs in the Bay Area were at risk. Her efforts will prevent others from going through the miserable suffering that I, and others, have had to endure."

Supervisor Migden will also continue her leading role in addressing the issue of breast cancer, which disproportionately affects women in the Bay Area. She is currently exploring the creation of a clinic for follow-up breast cancer exams.


"With Supervisor Migden leading the effort to improve breast cancer screening and education efforts, we can rest assured that we'll get results, not rhetoric," said Harvey Milk Club President Martha Knutzen, "I am confident that she will be a major force in the area of education, child care and women's health issues in Sacramento."
